Extending Christ's Love Update

The Building and Finance Committees continue to work diligently on developing the design and raising funds for our Christian Education Center. But what about our current facilities? What about capital improvement projects? Obviously, there are and will be needed improvements now and throughout the next five years of our Extending Christ's Love campaign. How will we fund these special projects?

20 years ago, during our Growing with Christ's Love campaign and the construction of our current church, any capital improvement project necessitated a smaller campaign to raise the needed funds. Members were asked to contribute to three funds at the same time (general fund, Growing with Christ's Love, special campaign). We met the challenge at that time and were able to make extensive repairs on the bell tower of the chapel, reroof,



install new sidewalks, and repair the south wall of the education building, as well as add insulation and improve lighting in the education building, even as we continued to support Growing with Christ's Love!

Although we accomplished what needed to be done 20 years ago, our congregational leaders have been working diligently to not put us in a place of simultaneous capital campaigns. Before beginning our Extending Christ's Love campaign, we conducted our Friends of Clifty Church campaign to replace the retaining wall, make needed repairs and improvements to the chapel, and move the bell to the newly constructed bell tower.

Last year, due to hail damage, all six HVAC units were replaced at the church, funded by insurance and your generosity through your general fund giving.

Going forward, our congregational leaders have identified capital improvement projects that need to be completed. They have developed a schedule and a plan to finance these projects. Our 2025 budget includes funds for repainting the sanctuary, the final area of our church that has not been repainted recently. Repainting will occur this week and next week (weeks of February 16 and 23).

In the coming years, some of these capital improvement projects will be included in the proposed budget while others will be funded through the unrestricted funds managed by our Endowments, Estates, and Trusts Committee. For example, the Endowments, Estates, and Trusts Committee has set aside funds to reroof our current church building at the same time the new Christian Education Center is being shingled.

Please continue to pray for Extending Christ's Love, for our congregation, our committees, and those who will be served through our Christian Education Center.
