Johann Mentzer (1658-1734) studied theology in Wittenberg and was first appointed to a parish as pastor in 1691. He was a prolific hymn writer but only two of his hymns are contained in our hymnal-LSB 647, Lord Jesus Christ, the Church's Head, and LSB 811. One of the characteristics of his hymnody is vivid imagery, which is clearly portrayed in the great hymn of praise, Oh, That I Had a Thousand Voices. Imagine the sound if each member of our congregation could sing unto the Lord with 1000 voices, rejoicing in the greatness of the wonders God has done for us! This hymn literally overflows with joy, thanksgiving, and adoration—all giving thanks to God alone for the excellence of His creation! The fourth stanza calls out for everyone to join in singing to the glory of God, our almighty Creator:

All creatures that have breath and motion,
That throng the earth, the sea, the sky,
Come, share with me my heart's devotion,
Help me to sing God's praises high.
My utmost powers can never quite
Declare the wonders of His might.

The last two phrases- my utmost powers can never quite declare the wonders of His might- are really amazing to meditate on. We can't even put into words the greatness of God's glory and strength! All glory be to God alone—now and forever!

Thanks to all our choirs and musicians for their time, talents, and dedication this past year in cradling the Word of God through the church's song. I'm looking forward to resuming rehearsals in August! In Christ's love,

# Early Childhood Ministry

Included in the outline of the St. Paul's stewardship report to the congregation are the labels, "People We Serve" and "People Who Serve Us." The fourth standard listed for the National Lutheran School Accreditation addresses the people who serve us. Beyond the legal requirements needed for employment, it is important to provide for the staff's needs so they can focus on supporting the various areas of student learning.

The vocations within education encompass the notion of being a life-long learner. Students teach educators what they know, so they can help children achieve the next level of learning. The number of things an educator needs to learn about child development continues to grow as new research directs developmentally appropriate practices in achieving required benchmarks for learning. Most importantly, the staff at St. Paul are tasked to participate in the Great Commission (Matthew 28: 18-20) by teaching our children what God instructs us in His Word.

To ensure that our teachers continue to learn, it is important that their education reflects their responsibilities. We want to make sure we offer the staff opportunities for professional development. The staff needs to be made aware of trending issues and practices related to student support. Above all, we want to make sure our staff is connected to Jesus, so they can reach out with God's love to serve our students.

# Christmas and New Year's Worship

For more than twenty years, we have offered two candlelight services at 6:30 and 11 PM on Christmas Eve. In 2003, the difference in attendance between the early and late services was fifteen people. Last Christmas, the early service attendance was more than three times greater than the late service. Even though our congregation has continued to grow, attendance at the 11 PM service has continued to decline. This is primarily due to the fact that our congregation continues to become younger with more families, which is a tremendous blessing. Typically, families with young children attend the early service, and often their grandparents join them so they can worship together on Christmas Eve.

The elders and pastors considered a number of options and are instituting the following changes this Christmas Eve and New Year's Eve:

Both Candlelight services on Christmas Eve will be moved one hour earlier to 5:30 PM and 10 PM:

Both services will follow a similar format as previous years.
 Both will have a different sermon and theme for those who

desire to worship twice on Christmas Eve. Both will be preceded with the singing of Christmas carols. The 10 PM service will include Communion and conclude with the singing of *Joy to the World.* 

- By maintaining the same amount of time between services, it will allow our pastors, kantor, musicians, and those who choose to attend both services opportunity for supper and family time.
- By moving the late service an hour earlier, it will make it easier for more of our church family to worship at 10 PM, to increase attendance at the late service.

The Christmas Day Festival Communion Service will begin at 10 AM as in past years.

The New Year's Eve Service will be moved one hour earlier and begin at **5:30 PM**. The pastors and elders are hopeful that more will choose to attend this service with the earlier time.

We are announcing these changes months before Christmas so that you are aware of our Christmas service times as you make plans for your family Christmas celebrations. Our pastors and elders are always open to your suggestions so please contact them with any comments or questions.

Each month the LWML highlights one or more of the 31 adopted 2023-2025 Mission Grants. May focused on two mission grants: Finish the Job Ministry in Mission (Haiti) and Feeding Haitian Children Through Gospel and Meals. #### Finish the Job Ministry in Mission, Haiti | \$85,000

Ministry in Mission is working with the Evangelical Lutheran Church of Haiti to complete repairs to churches that were damaged by an earthquake in 2021. The grant will allow the Lutheran church in Haiti to purchase the final items needed so their members can worship in a safe structure. Natural and manmade disasters test the Haitians, but the love of God gives them strength and confidence.

#### Feeding Haitian Children Through Gospel and Meals - Trinity HOPE | \$58,082

A common phrase in Haiti says, "An empty stomach has no ears!" The phrase simply means that the poverty-stricken Haitian children cannot retain or understand what they have been taught because they are unhealthy. This grant for Trinity HOPE will provide meals for children in a Lutheran school in Haiti. When the children receive the hot meal, they are reminded that their food is provided through the love of Jesus Christ. They can grow both physically and spiritually.

# Children are Always Welcome Here

The presence of children is a gift to the church. They are a reminder that our congregation is growing! Our congregation is blessed with many families with young children. This means that our entire church family has the opportunity to minister to and be an example for future generations. We also get to support their parents, as their first teachers, with a smile or word of encouragement. How children and families are welcomed in the church will have a direct impact on their views of church and their church family.

God made children full of wiggles and curiosity. Parents can be overwhelmed with these characteristics in children in quiet environments. Parents can be encouraged by knowing that most often your child's restlessness is more bothersome to you than those around you. God gifted parents with the very important role of raising their children up to know Him. This means bringing them to church and teaching them to worship Him. This vocation needs congregational support. Know that we as a church strive to support families well as they work to establish a firm foundation in Christ for their children.

There are many ways to help children feel more included in the service, which will help encourage them to participate. Repetition is intentionally used in our worship services. It allows children to catch on and follow along as they get older. Parents can take the time to point these parts out to children during the service and when they discuss worship at home. Singing the liturgy songs at bedtime or in the car is a great way to help children commit these songs to memory. Sitting near the front of the sanctuary helps children to better engage with the service because they are able to more clearly see what is happening during the service.
