### Extending Christ's Love through Prayer

Rejoice always, pray without ceasing, give thanks in all circumstances; for this is the will of God in Christ Jesus for you.

1 Thessalonians 5:16-18

Dear Friends in Christ.

As I write this article, Hurricane Milton is bearing down on Florida. When disaster or tragedy strikes, we should pray. In fact, we should always be praying, "pray without ceasing". We have needs and burdens, those we love have needs and burdens, our church family and our brothers and sisters in Christ throughout the world have needs and burdens, and those we do not know have needs and burdens. And so when anyone is in need, we take it to the Lord in prayer.

This holy conversation with our Creator in prayer is not only asking but also thanking. We are to "rejoice always" and "give thanks in <u>all</u> circumstances." Thus, when our heavenly Father gives His good gifts to us His children, we respond with thanks. November affords us the opportunity to especially reflect on this truth as we celebrate Thanksgiving. Through worship and gathering with our families, we take time to especially reflect on God's many blessings and respond with prayers of thanks, gratitude, and praise.

As we pray, Christ's love is extended to others. There is much confusion about the purpose of prayer. Some view prayer as a way to appease God or to get what you want. God doesn't need to be appeased by our prayers or any other good work we do. Christ's death for us on the cross has fully appeased God, satisfying the payment for our sins. God gifts of body and soul are given freely and generously, without any merit or worthiness in us. We don't pray to appease an angry God or to try and convince God to be gracious to us. God loves us and He is gracious to us.

Others view prayer as a way to change yourself or (even worse) to change others into what you want others to be. With this mindset, prayer is all about the individual, trying to conform God's perfect will to one's own will and desire.

Christ's love is extended through our praying because prayer is ultimately not about us and what we do or want, but about our loving God making us part of what He does. Let's use the perfect prayer, the Lord's Prayer to understand this truth. Jesus teaches us to pray "Hallowed by Thy name". God's name is holy, but when we pray these words, we are asking that His name would be kept holy in what we say and do. When we pray "Thy kingdom come", we are asking that God's kingdom of grace would come to us, that we would hunger for God's Word and His Supper and that God would use us to extend His kingdom of grace through our faithful witness. When we pray "Thy will be done," we are praying that God's good and gracious will be done among us, that we not live according to our sinful flesh, but instead, empowered by the Spirit, serve one another in love. When we pray, "Give us this day our daily bread," we are asking God to provide what we need for each day. This moves us to give thanks to God as the giver of every gift. But as we pray this petition, we realize that God uses us in His work of giving daily bread as we provide for our families and for the poor and those in need. When we pray "Forgive us our trespasses as we forgive those who trespass against us," we are confessing our sin and seeking Christ's forgiveness, and we are also asking God to use us in His forgiving work, extending His love through us by forgiving those who sin against us. When we pray "lead us not into temptation" and "deliver us from evil," we are not only asking God to give us strength in temptation and to protect us from the assaults and attacks of the devil, but God also brings us into His work through our praying, as we moved to help and support the tempted and sufferingthose recovering from natural disasters and the sick, addicted, and grieving.

Prayer is not about trying to appease God or manipulate God to get Him to give us what we want. Instead, in prayer God invites and brings us into His holy and good work, giving us the awesome privilege of being a part of what He does in this broken world. When we rightly understand prayer, then we see the tremendous power and the blessing of prayer and how God is at work through our praying, both our prayers of supplication and thanksgiving, to extend Christ's love to others. When we rightly receive and appreciate God's gift of prayer, we will find ourselves praying without ceasing and giving thanks to God in all circumstances.

# Early Childhood Ministry

The last standard our ECM will be evaluated on for the National Lutheran Accreditation involves the curriculum and instructional practice at the school. Over forty years ago, the founders of our preschool had the distinct goal of instructing young children using a Lutheran faith-based curriculum. It is an honor to maintain this goal in our educational practice today.

The second indicator in this section of the accreditation tool reads as follows:

The curriculum focuses on the faith-development of young children. Through the Word and Spirit of God, teachers nurture the spiritual development of children throughout the day by:

- Praying for them and teaching them to pray.
- · Using the Bible daily and teaching Bible words.
- Sharing Bible stories in developmentally appropriate ways.
- Worshiping with children in the classroom and in chapel and joining them in congregational worship.
- Praising God in song and with words and chants.
- Integrating faith development throughout the curriculum.
- Living out their faith in Jesus Christ by serving and reaching out to others.

The Indiana Department of Education has Early Learning Standards that establish learning trajectories for infants through kindergarten age. Our teachers do a great job of incorporating these educational goals in their lesson planning. My greatest joy is witnessing our school staff point our students to Jesus when they teach science, math, social studies, English/Language Arts, student wellbeing, approaches to play, creative arts, and physical health.

This standard is where our church and school staff unite. Our pastors are active in teaching the faith as they lead weekly Jesus times and monthly chapels. Our kantor takes time each week to help our students learn songs in our liturgy and chapel songs. Our administrative staff are out on the car line and in the hallways ready to serve, dry some tears, and support families.

Before we started our school year, our staff wrote down the names of every student enrolled in classes and took the time to pray for them and their family. Each day we get to know our students better and share with them the incredible gifts of love that God has given to us. Our desire is for our students and their parents to be a part of the family of God.

Your support of the mission and ministry of our school is priceless. Thank you for your prayers. Thank you for your encouragement. And thank you for helping us achieve our goals of renewing our accreditation and growing stronger in our service to young children!

### Christmas and New Year's Worship

For more than twenty years, we have offered two candlelight services at 6:30 and 11 PM on Christmas Eve. In 2003, the difference in attendance between the early and late services was fifteen people. Last Christmas, the early service attendance was more than three times greater than the late service. Even though our congregation has continued to grow, attendance at the 11 PM service has continued to decline. This is primarily due to the fact that our congregation continues to become younger with more families, which is a tremendous blessing. Typically, families with young children attend the early service, and often their

grandparents join them so they can worship together on Christmas Eve.

The elders and pastors considered a number of options and are instituting the following changes this Christmas Eve and New Year's Eve: Both Candlelight services on Christmas Eve will be moved one hour earlier to **5:30 PM and 10 PM:** 

- Both services will follow a similar format as previous years.
   Both will have a different sermon and theme for those who desire to worship twice on Christmas Eve. Both will be preceded with the singing of Christmas carols. The 10 PM service will include Communion and conclude with the singing of Joy to the World.
- By maintaining the same amount of time between services, it will allow our pastors, kantor, musicians, and those who choose to attend both services opportunity for supper and family time.
- By moving the late service an hour earlier, it will make it easier for more of our church family to worship at 10 PM, to increase attendance at the late service.

The Christmas Day Festival Communion Service will begin at 10 AM as in past years.

The New Year's Eve Service will be moved one hour earlier and begin at **5:30 PM**. The pastors and elders are hopeful that more will choose to attend this service with the earlier time.

We are announcing these changes so that you are aware of our Christmas service times as you make plans for your family Christmas celebrations. Our pastors and elders are always open to your suggestions so please contact them with any comments or questions.
