#### Extending Christ's Love through Visitation

Dear Friends in Christ,

We talk a lot about *Reaching Out with Christ's Love to Serve and Grow* and *Extending Christ's Love*. Often, we think of this as reaching out into our community and ultimately to the ends of the earth with the love of Christ and His saving Gospel. This is important. However, equally important is extending Christ's love to our brothers and sisters in Christ, those of our family of faith here at St. Paul. There are many ways that we can do this, but this month I would like us to consider how God calls us to reach out and extend His love to others through personal visitation and conversation.

Our Lord's earthly ministry is one of presence, care, and compassion. Jesus chooses to leave the glories of heaven and to come to this sinful and broken world to serve and to save. He is Immanuel, our *God with us*. He doesn't wait for people to come to Him. He travels from village to village. He meets people in the depths of their unbelief, sin, suffering, and sorrows and He saves, forgives, heals, and restores them.



We see our Lord's mercy in action when He raises the widow's son at Nain (Luke 7:11-17). As He approaches the funeral procession, Luke records that Jesus has *compassion* on this widow (7:13). Then He miraculously restores life to this child and gives him back to his mother. What I find fascinating is what the mourners from Nain say in response to this miracle. They exclaim: "God has **visited** His people!" (7:17)

Their confession is absolutely true. The God-man Jesus Christ had visited them. Jesus would extend love, care, compassion, and mercy to thousands of people during His earthly ministry. After His resurrection, Jesus appears to His disciples many times in their doubts and fears. He shows them His hands and His side. He gives them His peace.

This ministry of visitation and Christ-like presence, care, and compassion continues in the early church. Like our Lord, Paul desired to be physically present—going to places that hadn't heard the Gospel and also traveling hundreds of miles to visit established churches to encourage and strengthen believers. When there was a severe famine, Paul not only raised funds to support the believers in dire need, he personally brought these gifts to Jerusalem. It is estimated that Paul traveled over 15,000 miles during his ministry, most of which was by walking!

One of my greatest joys as your pastor is that the majority of my time is devoted to visitation. All three of us pastors are grateful for every opportunity to be present in your life, in times of joy and sorrow and everything in between. To be there for you and for all of God's people here at St. Paul by your hospital bed, in the nursing home, in your home, or meeting with you here at church. Please don't ever hesitate to reach out to us so that we can be present with you and for you in whatever your trial—sickness, grief, depression, anxiety, marital and family struggles—and extend the love, compassion, comfort, care, and forgiveness of Christ to you.

Likewise, consider how you can be present for others and be a vessel of Christ-like care and compassion. This begins by being present and actually getting to know your brothers and sisters in Christ. You can't respond to someone in need if you don't know them. Make it a priority to introduce yourself to the person sitting next to you in the pew. Don't rush out the door after church but stay to visit and fellowship with your forever family. During Lent, attend the meals before our Lenten services and sit next to someone you don't know or don't know very well and get to know them better over supper.

When you discover someone is in need, be present for them in their hour of trial. Pray for them. Then, consider how you can best extend the love, care, and compassion of Christ to them. It may be a personal visit or a phone call. It could be delivering a meal. It may be helping with our monthly Hickory Creek visit day or visiting those you know who are homebound or in the nursing home. It may be calling someone you haven't seen at church for a while to check in on them.

Our Lord is always present and there for us. He comes to us and visits us with His mercy, forgiveness, and compassion in His Word and His Supper. He then empowers us by His Spirit to be present in the lives of others, with HIS mercy, care, compassion, and love.

O Christ, You walked the road

Matthew 4: 1-11

Then Jesus was led by the Spirit into the wilderness to be tempted by the devil. And after fasting forty days and forty nights, he was hungry. And the tempter came and said to Him, "If You are the Son of God, command these stones to become loaves of bread." But He answered, "It is written.

" ' Man shall not live by bread alone, but by every word that comes from the mouth of God.'"

Then the devil took Him to the holy city and set Him on the pinnacle of the temple and said to Him, "If You are the Son of God, throw Yourself down, for it is written,

"'He will command His angels concerning You,' and, "'On their hands they will bear You up, lest You strike Your foot against a stone.'"

Again, the devil took Him to a very high mountain and showed Him all the kingdoms of the world and their glory. And he said to Him, "All these I will give You, if You fall down and worship me." Then the devil left Him, and behold, angels came and were ministering to Him.

Our will with Yours align. (LSB 424, stanza 4)

Lord, we pray that You will be with us through our Lenten journey. We rejoice that You loved us so much that You died for us, and we sing in thanks and praise for our redemption through You.

# Early Childhood Ministry

There are a lot of great learning opportunities for children (and adults) during seasons of the church year. Activities for Advent and Christmas are well known. How about the season of Lent?

Lent is a penitential season. During this time, we reflect on our sinful condition and take the time to humbly express our regret for our sinfulness. We recall the great sacrifice Jesus made on the cross to take our sins away.

All people have to deal with big emotions. As children grow, they look to adults to help them give name to the emotions they are experiencing and the tools they can use to process through these emotions in a healthy way. Sin brings sorrow, regret, and pain. Jesus' death and resurrection brings hope, joy, and love. Lent is a great time to teach our children about the powerful tools God gives us through confession and absolution.

Lent also brings a significant awareness of numbers. There are 40 days in Lent. These days can be translated to 6 weeks. We also have the days of Holy Week. Children can choose to count up or count down to Easter. As we mark the days, it is important to spend our time in God's Word and read about Jesus' journey to the cross and victory over sin, death, and the devil.

These are only a couple of ideas where we can apply practical learning to faith concepts. May your own learning experience during the time of Lent bring to light how God the Father still teaches all His children.

## **Extending Christ's Love Update**


