[The LORD said to Ezekiel:] "So you, son of man, I have made a watchman for the house of Israel. Whenever you hear a word from My mouth, you shall give them warning from Me. If I say to the wicked, O wicked one, you shall surely die, and you do not speak to warn the wicked to turn from his way, that wicked person shall die in his iniquity, but his blood I will require at your hand. But if you warn the wicked to turn from his way, and he does not turn from his way, that person shall die in his iniquity, but you will have delivered your soul.

"And you, son of man, say to the house of Israel, Thus have you said: 'Surely our transgressions and our sins are upon us, and we rot away because of them. How then can we live?' Say to them, As I live, declares the LORD GOD, I have no pleasure in the death of the wicked, but that the wicked turn from his way and live; turn back, turn back from your evil ways, for why will you die, O house of Israel?

"And you, son of man, say to your people, The righteousness of the righteous shall not deliver him when he transgresses, and as for the wickedness of the wicked, he shall not fall by it when he turns from his wickedness, and the righteous shall not be able to live by his righteousness when he sins. Though I say to the righteous that he shall surely live, yet if he trusts in his righteousness and does injustice, none of his righteous deeds shall be remembered, but in his injustice that he has done he shall die. Again, though I say to the wicked, 'You shall surely die,' yet if he turns from his sin and does what is just and right, if the wicked restores the pledge, gives back what he has taken by robbery, and walks in the statutes of life, not doing injustice, he shall surely live; he shall not die. None of the sins that he has committed shall be remembered against him. He has done what is just and right; he shall surely live.

"Yet your people say, 'The way of the Lord is not just,' when it is their own way that is not just. When the righteous turns from his righteousness and does injustice, he shall die for it. And when the wicked turns from his wickedness and does what is just and right, he shall live by this. Yet you say, 'The way of the Lord is not just.' O house of Israel, I will judge each of you according to his ways."

[Paul writes:] For I do not want you to be unaware, brothers, that our fathers were all under the cloud, and

all passed through the sea, and all were baptized into Moses in the cloud and in the sea, and all ate the same spiritual food, and all drank the same spiritual drink. Extending Christ's Love Update

On Friday, March 14th, our church building was filled with incredible joy and activity as more than 200 students, grandparents, and special friends participated in Grandparents Day. The day began in worship with chapel, with voices of all ages singing praises to our God. The theme of Grandparents Day was the Wilderness, which corresponds to our Lenten sermon series and the theme for this year's Vacation Bible School: The WAY in the Wilderness. After chapel, we headed to the fellowship room for a presentation and activities. You can imagine the fellowship room bursting at its seams with all the students and their grandparents.

Events like Grandparents Day highlight our need for additional space for ministry. Through your support of Extending Christ's Love, our Great Hall in the new Christian Education Center will be more than 50% larger than our current fellowship room. With the church and school in one building, classrooms will also be able to be utilized for activities.

In addition, your support of Extending Christ's Love will enable us to serve more children and their families through our early childhood ministry. We are five months from the beginning of the school year, and we already have 59 children enrolled. *Thanks be to God*!

Unfortunately, we have only one opening remaining in the Little Doves, four-year-old class for the coming school year. Once we have one more registration, all others will have to be turned away. The kindergarten and Little Lambs (three-year-old) classes are also nearing capacity with nine openings in kindergarten and eight in the Little Lambs class. The Christian Education Center will give us the ability to expand our early childhood ministry from the current three classrooms to six classrooms, doubling the number of students and families we can serve.
