I was recently asked why the pipe organ is the main instrument used in Lutheran worship. It's both an excellent question and topic of discussion for this article. Even though the development of the pipe organ has secular roots dating back to ancient Egypt, by the time of the Reformation it was commonly found in churches and used to lead congregational singing.

The pipe organ enables one person to lead the singing of hymns and liturgies to a large group in a large room. The sound of a well designed and properly voiced instrument can be varied to fit the text and tune of a wide variety of hymns, assisting the proclamation of the Gospel through the song of the church. Foundational sounds are critical in supporting both male and female voices and the basis of sound in the pipe organ are the principal pipes, which are unique to the instrument and not found elsewhere. By adding principal ranks at different pitch levels, the organist can provide both support and brilliance to encourage congregational singing. Additionally, since the pipe organ is a wind-blown instrument played with keys, the sound of the pipes continues as long as a key is depressed. This differs from the piano, which provides its loudest sound when initially struck and then begins to decay quickly. The sound of the piano is more percussive than the pipe organ, while the sound of the pipe organ is more easily sustained.

Singing is a very important part of Lutheran worship and occurs throughout the entire service. From a practical standpoint, one instrument that can lead, support, and encourage singing is very desirable and helpful in providing consistency during worship.

Additionally, the organ partners well not only with human voices but also most instruments. The addition of handbells and brass, woodwind, and string instruments helps provide variety and blends well with the many different colors of sound found in the various pipes. The pipe organ and piano can also compliment each other, either played together or in alternation.

The historic use of the pipe organ in Lutheran worship is therefore rooted in practicality—it is both efficient and effective!
